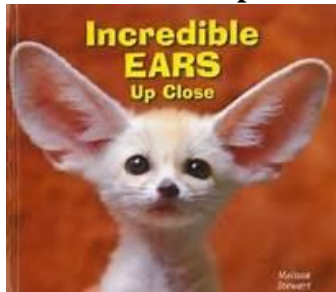




Nonfiction Text Feature Posters

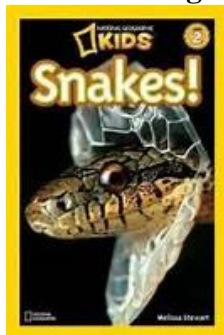

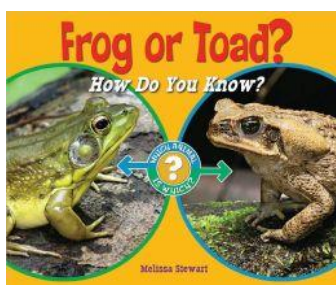

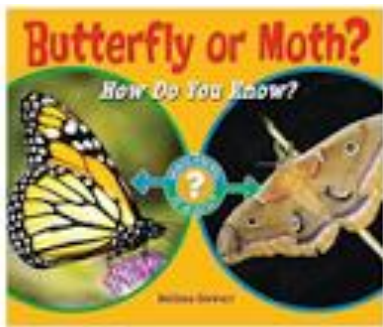

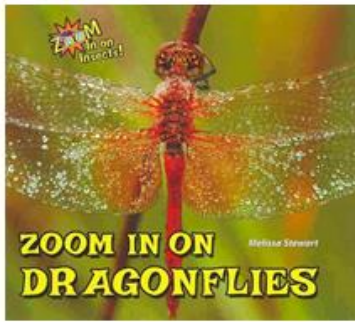

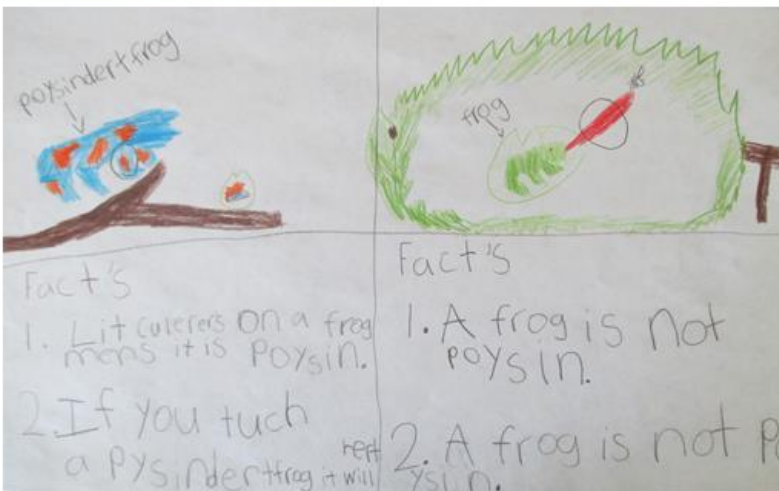
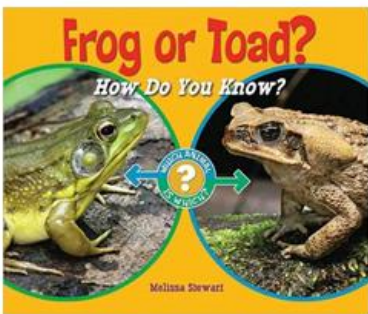
